

UPPER STATION CAMP GREENWAY

The proposed section of the USCG Phase 1 is in the design phase with Civil Site Design Group. It is a continuation of the greenway network and will begin near the intersection of Long Hollow Pike (SR 174) and Lower Station Camp Creek Road at the existing historic Douglass-Clark House trailhead located at 2115 Long Hollow Pike (SR174), Gallatin, TN 37066.

The trail will run north a total length of 8,150 linear feet and will parallel Station Camp Creek. The proposed terminus for Phase 1 is at the proposed 265 acre school campus owned by Sumner County along Upper Station Camp Creek Rd.

The County proposes constructing a 10-foot wide concrete multi-use path since the majority of the trail area is in the floodplain/floodway; concrete will be more durable and sustainable than an asphalt option.

By providing a link to existing and future development, the intent of this project is to

- increase the number of residents walking/biking,
- reduce the existing traffic congestion,
- improve air quality and
- enhance the quality of life in the surrounding area

The greenway will provide an alternative bike and pedestrian transportation route for local residents to access schools, the historic Douglass-Clark House, and neighborhoods set within a natural, rural setting along the Long Hollow Pike corridor and Station Camp area.

This project will improve walking and bicycling conditions in Sumner County. Currently, many bikers utilize Upper Station Camp Creek Road, a two lane road, for biking. This project will provide the infrastructure necessary for pedestrians/bikers for safe access.
